She then started offering businesses her own creative animation production.

2022 - Associate Producer at Hornet. Learned that consultants make a lot of money and function heavily on freelance work.

2023 - Back at Baboon but as a freelance writer. Be true to yourself.

Some of the questions you need to ask yourself are more or less important depending on the area of work you want to go in.

For Juliette it was important what are her strengths, what can she specifically bring to the animation industry that she is absolutely passionate about and how can I focus on these strengths during her degree and beyond?

This will inform who you connect with, the types of internships you look for, and your long term vision when applying for jobs.

For Juliette it was important for her to finish her film on time because it would prove she could succeed as a production coordinator.

~ Internships ~

- Who me? Yes you!
- Get into an internship program at an animation company you love is really important.
- Look for somebody you know who could introduce you.
- Add something memorable to your application (when applying to Aardman, she made a small film of her looking for internships in the studio)

~ In the studio ~

- "You're gonna be working with all my friends!"
- professional interaction in animation in NYC and LA are on relatively informal, often friendly terms.
 - animation execs value people who are friendly, passionate, and knowledgeable nerds - like them!

~ How do you fit in? ~

- Animation Nerd: know your writers, directors.
- Stay up to date on your animation news (Animation Network)
- Fluency in different languages? (Learn French?)
 - Entrepreneurial vibes: set up your own small business.
 - Eyes on the goal

~ How are you unique? ~

- What am I passionate about? (time flies when I am doing it)

- What can I be the best in the world at?
(with 8 hours of practice per day)
- What is society ready to pay for?

~ Do US Studios know who you are? ~

- Be far sighted. Start talking to anyone you can, without letting one failed attempt discourage you. (LinkedIn, email, NY wishes)
- Be very specific about your career goals (have a dream job in mind), show a targeted skillset, proving how your dream job has informed your decisions.
- Be memorable
- Don't lose touch with people.

Send your film to as many festivals as you can.

At Media 3, you mentioned you became HD quickly. Having worked in a small studio, did you find they were more likely to mentor & teach you, or the opposite, like you just had to figure it out?

It happened naturally, there wasn't much stress on it. Initially, she was taught a lot but actively sought out advice and learnt more. The team kept teaching her a lot of things.

Having gone into production, were there any other short courses you took to improve? Or were the previous jobs you had that helped you go in this direction?

Media 3 was the only job she sort of job she got through regular HR job channels. She only had regular job like a library assistant.

Whenever there's a program she can see a company is looking for, she watches a lot of tutorials/videos on it to better understand it.
